<u>Building Access</u>: Allschool buildings in SMSD continue to be closed, and will remain closed, except for essential functions, through **July 20, 2020**. Building access remains restricted to staff members only!

Student MacBooks/iPads: All seniors and students who are not returning to South must return MacBooks prior to June 5, 2020. Freshman, Sophomores, and Juniors are instructed to keep their MacBook over the summer. Any student with an iPad will need to return their device prior to June 5. Students/parents who do NOT wish to retain their MacBook over the summer can also return their device when they return textbooks, etc.

<u>Outdoor Activities Begin July 6:</u> In compliance with the Kansas Framework and KSHSAA guidelines, outdoor activities, such as conditioning for fall sports and band practice, may begin starting on July 6, 2020.

<u>Personal Item Retrieval:</u> All textbooks, library books, etc. have already been removed from student lockers. Students (or parents) are not allowed to enter the building until July 20. This means students that still have personal items in their locker/gym locker will not be allowed to retrieve them until July 20.

If you need an item(s) from your **locker** before then, you will sign up for a day/time, and a staff member will retrieve the item(s) for you and bring it to your vehicle. You must complete the <u>Personal Item Retrieval Request Form</u> and include your LOCKER NUMBER and member of our office staff will reach out to you via email to schedule a day and a pick-up time beginning on June 1, 2020.



WE KNOW THE YEARBOOK IS A BIG PART OF OUR NORMAL END-OF-YEAR ACTIVITIES. COVID-19 HAS DEFINITELY MESSED THINGS UP SOME, BUT WE HAVE SOME INFO WE WANT TO SHARE ABOUT HERITAGE 2020.

WHEN WILL THE YEARBOOKS ARRIVE?

 Our yearbook publisher, Balfour, started printing again May 18, after being shutdown due to COVID-19. Right now the estimated arrival date for the yearbooks is the first week of July.

WHEN WILL THE YEARBOOKS BE PASSED OUT TO STUDENTS?

- Once the yearbooks arrive at South, they have to be checked for misprints and damage, and then sorted. Due to restrictions, the yearbook staff will likely be unable to assist with this process. Our adviser and other South faculty will hopefully be able to sort and prep all of the books by July 14, but there is no guarantee.
- Our hope is that books will be distributed before the end of July.

MOW WILL YEARBOOKS BE DISTRIBUTED?

• This is dependent on state guidelines and difficult to determine at this point. Our most likely distribution method will be a "drive-thru" scenario where students or their parents come to South and pick up their yearbook without getting out of their car. It will likely be similar to the senior check-in/check-out or underclassmen check-in process. The official plan will be shared at a later date, once it is determined.

HOW DO I KNOW IF I PURCHASED A YEARBOOK?

- You should be able to check your Skyward account fees to see if you purchased a yearbook at fee payment last July.
- Another way to check is your receipt if you purchased a yearbook in person from T. Love. That receipt proves you purchased a yearbook.
- The final way to check is to contact T. Love at tuckerlove152@smsd.org. He has the final list of all yearbook purchases, as of May 18.

WILL THERE BE EXTRA YEARBOOKS?

 There are extra yearbooks ordered and the plant typically sends overruns – extra books printed during the publishing process. These books can be sold, but they will not be sold during the distribution event. Please see the next point.

CAN I STILL PURCHASE A YEARBOOK?

- At this time, no. Unfortunately we have no means to process card payments for yearbooks right now and we will not be conducting cash sales during our modified distribution method for health and logistical reasons. If this changes, new information will be pushed out regarding the sales process.
- We want to sell all of the books we can and get a yearbook into as many South students' hands as possible. Once we can determine the best way to safely process payments, we will sell as many books as we have available.

WHAT IF I HAVE ANOTHER QUESTION NOT LISTED HERE?

Dear Raiders,

I wanted to make a couple of very important announcements as we start to anticipate summer activities! We have hired two new head coaches. First, Aaron Dean, current SM South Science teacher, has been named the boys' soccer head coach. Coach Dean has been a staff coach on the team the last 4 years. Coach Dean is a wonderful addition to the SM South head Coach roster and is excited to get going!



A physical examination (PPE), conducted by a healthcare professional after May 1st, is required each year to participate in sports and spirit teams. 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Pandemic EBT

While schools are closed due to COVID-19, families with children age 5-18 who received free or reduced-priced meals from August 2019-May 2020 will receive up to \$291 per child in Pandemic EBT (P-EBT) benefits to purchase food. This benefit is in addition to any other services families are currently receiving.

How will families receive their P-FRT henefits?

Most families with eligible children recently or currently participating in Food Assistance, Child Care or TANF (cash assistance) programs will automatically receive the onetime benefit to their EBT card in the next few weeks

Families not actively participating in these programs, but whose children receive free or reduced-price meals will be mailed a Kansas Benefits Card with benefits pre-loaded in the next few weeks. If these families do not receive a Kansas Benefits card by **June** 5th, they may need to provide additional information to DCF. These families should watch for a confidential weblink provided by their school district.


Use it like a debit card.

Families will receive the P-EBT benefit on a Kansas Benefits Card. This card functions like a debit card and can be used to purchase eligible fooditems at EBT authorized retailers. Non-food items *may not* be purchased with this card
