Wednesday, February 20, 2019 - Free ACT Testing for Juniors and Qualifying Seniors Thursday, February 21, 2019 - Free WorkKeys Testing for Juniors and Qualifying Seniors

Who is eligible to take the Statewide ACT & ACT WorkKeys Opportunity?

- All Juniors are eligible to sign-up for the ACT & ACT WorkKeys assessment.
- Only seniors, who have *not yet taken* an ACT or the ACT WorkKeys assessment.

Why should my junior or qualifying senior consider taking the statewide ACT or WorkKeys?

 All colleges and universities in the United States accept ACT scores. Students will be able to report their Kansas-sponsored ACT scores just like any other ACT test. 	ACT WorkKeys measures Career Readiness skills for success in the workplace. Many employers already use the Kansas <i>WORKReady!</i> Certificate to identify quality applicants.
◆The ACT is designed to measure skills that are most important for success in postsecondary education and that are acquired in secondary education.	Students who successfully complete all three WorkKeys assessments—Applied Math, Graphic Literacy, and Workplace Documents—can earn a WorkKeys National Career Readiness Certificate
The ACT contains four multiple-choice tests—	and/or a Kansas WORKReady! Certificate.
English, mathematics, reading, and science. (*There will NOT be an optional writing section offered on this date.)	▶For more information, please visit the Kansas Department of Commerce.

When & where will the ACT / ACT work keys tests be administered?

- The ACT assessment will take place the morning of Wednesday, February 20, 2019
- The ACT Work Keys assessment will take place the morning of Thursday, February 21, 2019.
- Students will be assigned testing locations at Shawnee Mission South High School.

How will my student learn about test results?

- Students may request to have their scores sent to colleges.
- For the ACT, students will receive one paper copy score report, mailed to their home address three to eight weeks after testing. Students will also have access to an online account to view their results at <u>www.actstudents.org</u>.
- For WorkKeys, students will be able to view their scores at <u>www.myworkkeys.com</u>.



SPEAK UP will provide education and awareness, bridging gaps between the community, schools and parents. Most importantly, to teach kids that it is okay to ask for help.
