- Register online at <u>actstudent.org</u>
- Exam fees:
 - Full Test, Without writing: \$60
 - Full Test With writing: \$85
 - Waivers
 - Students on free or reduced lunch qualify for four ACT fee waivers throughout their high school career.

Advanced Placement ®: The Basics

- AP® courses are college-level courses offered in high school
- Scores scaled from 1-5, with 5 being the best.
- A score of 3 or higher on an AP Exam may earn students college credit and/or placement into advanced courses in college.
- Each College has an AP Policy. <u>Students should check colleges</u> of interest on how scores apply.

Testing will take place in two-week window in May (May 2-6 & 9-13)

Our AP[®] Courses

- Arts: Art Studio Art: Drawing Portfolio, Studio Art: 2-D Design Portfolio, Studio Art: 3-D Design Portfolio, Music Theory
- **English:** English Language and Composition (11th), English Literature and Composition (12th)
- History and Social Sciences: European History, Macroeconomics, Microeconomics, Psychology, United States Government and Politics, United States History
- Mathematics and Computer Science: Calculus AB, Calculus BC, Statistics, Computer Science A
- Sciences: Biology, Chemistry, Physics 1: Algebra-based
- World languages: French Language and Culture, Spanish Language and Culture

AP®: The Benefits

- Students learn rigorous college-level content and skills.
- AP Designation on HS transcript.
- Reflects student challenged themselves in class choices.
- Opportunity to earn college credit or advanced standing in college.
- Credits more widely accepted than dual credit, especially at selective colleges. (Non Kansas colleges)
- Less expensive than dual credit.

Advanced Placement Testing

Things to consider:

 Students need to do some of their own preparation outside of class to be ready for AP test.

 Student has one chance to perform well on day of testing

New AP Registration Process

Three Steps in Registering

1. Student creates a College Board Account

2. Student will get classroom code from teacher of course to register in College Board for exam

3. Pay Fees through Total Registration

Deadlines/Cost of Exams

Test registration and fee payment deadline.

Cost per exam: \$105 if ordered by Oct 29th

\$40 Late fee after 11/15/21

\$40 Penalty for cancellation after 11/15/21 or non test.

AP English Language

- Juniors who took the AP English Language
 Test last spring & received a 4 or 5 (and
 maybe a 3) may already have earned credit
 at their college choice. Check colleges' AP
 policies before enrolling in Composition 1 this
 fall.
- Juniors in AP Eng Lang, 11th can take AP test, but this is not a College Now class.

Concurrent Enrollment through JCCC

- College Now (Concurrent or Dual credit enrollment) — Taught by SMS faculty, who are accredited through JCCC. Student receives both high school and college credit simultaneously. There is no limit on the amount of credit a student may earn through JCCC.
- 2. Quick Step Plus— Course modeled after JCCC's self-paced math courses. A JCCC math professor assesses the student's mastery of the course content for credit. The assessment is done at the high school. Successful students will earn 3 credit hours of College Algebra credit.. Deadlines are different for Quick Step Plus than for College Now.

Who is eligible for either?

According to the Kansas Board of Regents, any freshman (with a gifted IEP), sophomores, juniors and seniors in high school can take classes for college credit.

JCCC Enrollment Guide

 <u>College Now courses that require enrollment only</u> for the fall are: AP Biology 2, AP Microeconomics, Spanish 5AP, AP Statistics, AP US Government

<u>College Now Courses that require enrollment in the</u>
 fall AND spring are: AP English 12, AP European
 History, AP US History

 The College Now course which requires ONLY spring semester enrollment is AP Macroeconomics

College Algebra/Trig Math Class

- Not part of the College Now program. Called Quick Step Plus.
- JCCC representative will be in classes in September to explain program. Teachers can answer questions.
- Deadline to enroll is different than College Now deadline. It is October 8, 2021. (<u>firm deadline</u>)
- Must have appropriate ACT math score (22) or pass ACCUPLACER placement test at JCCC to take class for credit.

JCCC College Programs

Steps to Enroll

- 1. Apply to JCCC free, one-time application www.jccc.edu
- 2. Provide ACT scores or take Accuplacer test

ACT scores are on the SMS transcript. Students can send through Xello to JCCC

The Accuplacer test is available at the JCCC testing center for students who have not yet taken the ACT. Must schedule for the test.

- 3. Enroll using CRN numbers provided by JCCC
 - On our counseling website and on JCCC website search under College Now)
- 4. Pay for the class Current cost is \$94/credit hour.

College NOw ACT/AP/GPA Waiver

Certain classes such as English, chemistry, math, physics require students to either take a placement test and obtain a qualifying score or have a qualifying score from the ACT or AP exam on file. https://www.jccc.edu/admissions/early-college/high-school-concurrent-enrollment/high-school-testing.html

JCCC College Now Program

- Cost is \$94 per credit hour for Johnson County resident
- All courses are 3 (\$282), 4 (\$376), or 5 (\$470)credits
- There is a grant program for students on free or reduced lunch for JCCC College Now only
- Reasonable price for college credit

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KU 3 credits = @$958 / KSU 3 credits = @$901
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Textbook is provided in the College Now program

Benefits of JCCC Enrollment

- Quality Instruction All instructors are qualified high school teachers that have similar experiences of faculty on campus.
- Low Cost Significantly lower than area public and private colleges and universities.
- Schedule flexibility in college Students complete general education courses while still in high school.
- Double major, graduate early, study abroad without extending
- TEXTBOOKS ARE PROVIDED Saves \$\$\$
- JCCC Campus Access Students have access to all resources that are offered to other JCCC college students, such as the Math Resource Center, the Writing Center, library, and computer labs.
- May allow a student to graduate from college early, graduate on time, do study abroad, double major, etc.

How do these classes transfer?

- JCCC classes have excellent transferability to colleges or universities in the state of Kansas. You can check the websites for transferability or contact the school directly.
- Even though the classes will transfer to most colleges and universities, how it transfers to each individual school and major may be different. Always contact college personnel when in question. Ask if the classes are figured into that school's GPA or just transfer as credit.
- It would also be wise to research potential majors to see what class requirements a student may need. This will help you better determine which classes you should take now while in high school.

College Now Program

- Check to see if college of choice will accept the credit and how they accept the credit
- Parents and students must do some research to make sure this is a good investment
