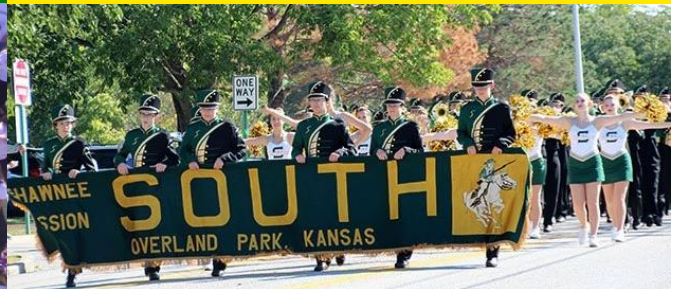

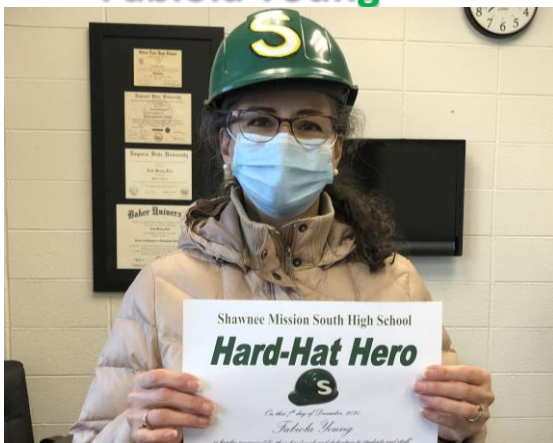

## Support Your Student During Remote Learning

- Check In - check in with your child on how they are feeling emotionally and how their stress levels are
- Focus on Skills - ask them what skills they are learning or what they are reading in their classes
- Praise Effort - find small successes and let them know their effort is noticed even if their answers are not always right
- Set Routines - help them to set routines and systems to help them be successful
- Encourage Socially Distanced Learning - encourage them to set up study groups or check ins with their friends online
- Support - help them find audiobook if needed, sit and quiz them on vocabulary or other content

Students in seventh through 12<sup>th</sup> grade will be involved in generating their individual **YouScience Profile**. YouScience is a researched-based tool with a goal to identify your student's interests and aptitudes and connect them with in-demand careers. Through a series of scientific-based assessments, YouScience uncovers your student's natural talents, then combines those aptitude measures with interests to generate their specific profile. High school student exercises will take 90 minute and be done in five-15-minute segments over two to three days. The scientific-based assessments will include exercises related to a variety of focus areas such as numerical reasoning, vocabulary, interpersonal style, etc.

Your student's profile will provide powerful and actionable insight that can be applied to their academics. There is also practical information, like what they can expect to get paid for a specific profession. The profile includes:

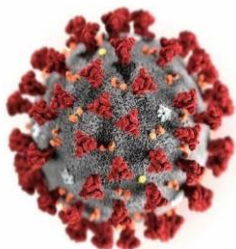

## WHAT IS MENTAL HEALTH?

\*a person's condition with regard to their psychological and emotional well-being.

Mental health can be affected by feeling pressured, stress, loneliness, and any changes in day-to-day life. We are researching ways to improve students, parents, and teachers mental health. With the unprecedented times, we wanted to inform everyone of the risks and effects of mental health, as well as tips to overcome personal difficulties.



## TIPS

- Journal
  - Writing down how you are feeling can help let out your emotions
- Meditation
  - Meditation can help you find a moment of silence and relaxation in your day
- Maintain a daily routine
  - Keeping a pattern in your schedule helps cut down on stress.
- Get involved
  - Join a club or sport at school
  - Join a virtual club to stay safe at home
- Talk to someone you trust
  - Counselor/teacher
  - Parent/guardian
  - Therapist



## STATISTICS

- More than 11% of adolescents and teens report experiencing at least one major depressive episode in the last year, and the numbers continue to climb
- 50% of mental health issues are established by the age of 14, and 75% by age 24.
- Worldwide, 15-23% of children live with a parent with a mental illness. These children have up to 50% chance of developing a mental illness

## Picture make-ups and retakes

**Wednesday, December 16 ~ 3:30-6:30pm**

The SM South picture make-up day will be **Wednesday, December 16<sup>th</sup>** from 3:30 6:30. We will be utilizing a Sign-Up Genius to schedule student's attendance. If time slots for the picture day fill up, we will expand the time frame to 3:30–7:30.

The 400+ students who did not have a picture taken during our October picture days will receive an email on November 30<sup>th</sup>. This email will include information to sign up for a picture day time slot. These students will have a week to sign up for a time before students requesting a picture retake gain access to the

Students who wish to have a RETAKE picture done — meaning, you had a picture taken in October and would like to have a new one taken — will receive the information to sign up for a picture day time slot on December 7<sup>th</sup>.

Students will be required to wear a mask over their mouth and nose in order to enter the school building. They will wear their mask until their photographer instructs them to take it off for their picture. Once the picture is taken, students must put their mask back on before exiting. Any student not wearing a mask or refuses to wear a mask correctly will not be allowed to enter the building. Physical distancing measures will be in place in order to keep students separated. Adult staff will be present and signs will be posted to help direct students to the spaces they need to go to and keep them distanced. We request that parents and guardians do not come in with their students in order to minimize the number of people inside the building and the picture taking location. If you must come in, you will also be required to wear a mask over your mouth and nose.
