Students in seventh through 12th grade will be involved in generating their individual **YouScience Profile**. YouScience is a researched-based tool with a goal to identify your student's interests and aptitudes and connect them with in-demand careers.Through a series of scientific-based assessments, YouScience uncovers your student's natural talents, then combines those aptitude measures with interests to generate their specific profile. High school student exercises will take 90 minute and be done in five-15-minute segments over two to three days.The scientific-based assessments will include exercises related to a variety of focus areas such as numerical reasoning, vocabulary, interpersonal style, etc.


Your student's profile will provide powerful and actionable insight that can be applied to their academics. There is also practical information, like what they can expect to get paid for a specific profession. The profile includes:
